

WPEC Committees as Defined in the Constitution

WPEC Committees are governed by Article XI of the constitution. All members of standing and ad hoc committees (except the Bargaining Support Committee) shall be appointed by the President from a pool of regular members who volunteer for such committees, except only stewards are eligible to serve on the Stewardship and Grievance Committee, which shall be comprised of stewards. Such appointments shall be made with the approval of the Executive Council. Once appointed, each committee shall choose one of the members to act as chair of the committee.

The standing committees shall have duties as defined by the Executive Council and the WPEC Constitution and shall be as follows:

- Audit
- Bargaining Support Committee
- Budget
- Communications
- Committee on Political Education (COPE)
- Constitution
- Convention
- Election
- Membership
- Organizing
- Stewardship and Grievance
- Policy and Procedure

The Executive Council shall have the power to create ad hoc committees as necessary. Such committees shall have a specific purpose and a specific time in which to complete their work. Extensions of time for ad hoc committee work may be granted by the Executive Council.

The current Ad Hoc committees are as follows:

- Bargaining Review
- Contracting Out
- Promoting State Employees
- Technology Planning

All committees of the Union, both standing committees and ad hoc committees, shall report annually to the membership at the annual convention.
