Governor Walker's proposed budget:

- Cuts \$300 million from the University of Wisconsin System
- Eliminates funding for alternative energy research and other environmental programs at UW-Madison
- Cuts 66 DNR staff scientists and educators
- Freezes land purchases by the Knowles-Nelson Stewardship Fund
- Eliminates the ability of the Natural Resources Board to set policy

Expert panelists will discuss the long-term ramifications of these attacks on science for Wisconsin's conservation heritage and how the public can respond.
